Cast:

Priya Hall Leila Navabi Robin Morgan

[Here to Judge Theme Song]

Robin: Welcome to Here to Judge where we scour the internet

to dissect dilemmas and decide who's to blame. Here to

Judge today is me, Robin Morgan.

Priya: Me, Priya Hall.

Leila: And me, Leila Navabi.

'Am I the asshole for throwing away a whole pot of chilli out of spite? I'm extremely sensitive to the taste of salt, nothing will happen to me health wise if I do eat a lot, but I absolutely cannot stand it and salted food is inedible to me. My boyfriend, on the other hand, is a salt fiend, he adds extra salt to everything, which is fine, everybody has their own taste palate, I don't care what he does with his own food.' Sounds like you do but OK.

Robin: Mm.

Leila: 'I got up yesterday and decided to do chilli in the crock-

pot. 5pm rolls around, chilli is done, we bowl up for dinner. I'm not very hungry so I just make a tiny bowl with the plan to go back later. I made 10 quarts with the idea of leftovers for at least two days.' Info- 1 quart equals 1.1 litres, I've never heard of the measurement

quart ever.

Priya: No, nor me.

Leila: Anyone?

Robin: No but also like I'd love a chilli right now. I'll have two

pints of chilli please [laughs] I'm just going to down a jug

o' chilli.

Priya: What about ten litres of chilli? [Laughs]

Leila:

Yeah, mm, OK. 'I go back a few hours later and make another small bowl and shrivel into a raisin upon taking the first bite.' [laughs] 'He didn't just salt his bowl, he salted the entire pot. Now, I'm aware that 99% of the population would probably have to season their bowl, I expect people to. When I have someone over to eat I tell them I don't use much salt and direct them to the shaker so they can do up their own portion how they like it. Robin: [Laughs]

Leila:

'I didn't say anything, I just dumped my bowl. I was pissed, feeling disrespected and uncared for and in the heat of the moment, I dumped the rest of the pot. My thought process was, if I can't eat, neither can he. He has a habit of getting up at 1am and digging into leftovers, so like clockwork he goes downstairs, digs around in the fridge, then stomps back up to our room and asks 'where the fuck' the chilli went. I told him I threw it out because it was inedible, and he lost it about wasting food. He said it's not his fault I have no sense of taste and didn't think I wanted any more. 10 quarts of chilli and he thought 9 of it was solely his, apparently. This is the first time I've actually thrown out basically a whole dish, normally I just bitch at him about it, remind him to stop doing it and

move on. This time I just snapped, I guess. It seems like such a dumb thing to fight over, and now that I've thought about it, I wonder if I did overreact. I'm still pissed but it does feel petty and wasteful. I vented in my group chat and it's been a mix of 'Your food your choice' and 'It's just salt, get over it'. Am I the asshole for throwing it away purely out of spite?

Priya: This is a mad amount of chilli for any person to make.

Leila: For any reason.

Priya: Yeah.

Robin: Yeah.

Leila: At all.

Priya: The notion of someone pouring away 9 litres of chilli.

Robin: Where are you pouring that?

Priya: Exactly. You can't put it in the bin.

Robin: It's just like hot steaming salty chilli...

Leila: Uh!

Robin: ...just straight into the black bag [laughs].

Priya: [Laughs] And it's like dripping and leaking onto your

carpet.

Robin: Yeah just humming.

Priya: [Laughs]

Leila: Uh!

Robin: You can't put it in the food bin because the food recycling

bins are like that big, that's like a quart.

Priya: [Laughs]

Robin: You'd have to empty it 11 times taking it outside.

Leila: Do you know what's gone through my head is that she's

put it in the toilet.

Priya: Oh God [laughs]. How many flushes before there's no

more chilli in that water?

Robin: Their relationship sounds utter dog shit.

Priya: Oh yeah.

Robin: If he continually-- she writes incredibly well, I really

enjoyed some of the turns of phrases such as 'ready to

bowl up'.

Leila: [Laughs]

Robin: I enjoyed that. I'm going to use that next time I eat. And

also the idea that he salts her world. You know like if you don't want someone's crops to grow you salt their land.

Leila: [Laughs]

Priya: [Laughs]

Robin: He is salting her entire life.

Leila: She is but the slug in his slimy world and he's just trying

to.

Robin: [Laughs] Exactly.

Priya: No joy can grow.

Leila: Have you ever done that, have you ever salted a slug

before?

Robin: Shamefully yes.

Leila: I have as well. I'm really sorry.

Priya: I would never! Why did you guys do this? Is this a thing

that people do?

Robin: We did it last week.

Priya: Sure.

Leila: Yeah we did it last week, pre lockdown fun.

Robin: Our pre lockdown treat. That was it, nothing in the rules

about that Drakeford. [Laughs]

Priya: So far.

Leila: Yeah, yeah, yeah. Salting a slug, Tier 5, you're not allowed

to salt any slugs. [Laughs]

Robin: [Laughs]

Priya: It was written by slugs, it's written in like slug trails.

Leila: That's so funny. Imagine? That's is weird though that

she's like so averse to salt.

Priya: I know people who are like that. My brother is really,

really sensitive to salt, so you have to...

Leila: Really?

Priya: Yeah it's basically the same thing, and he's brown, so I

don't know where it comes from.

Leila: Yeah that's strange.

Priya: My partner is white so whenever I cook anything I have

to basically accept that I'm going to have to add loads of pots all separately. Because if I make it to the taste I want

it, he will shit through his eyes.

Robin: [Laughs]

Leila: Yeah.

Priya: And I just have to accept that. Because I don't want him

to shit through his eyes, I will make the sacrifice.

Robin: Yeah for better or for worse, for richer or for poorer. For

spice or for bland [laughs].

Leila: Yeah, yeah.

Robin: The dude sounds like-- if it's the first time you can kind of

be like maybe he's just sort of absent minded. But if he's

continually salting her life.

Priya: [Laughs]

Robin: But also he wakes up at 1am, to sort of stomp down like a

hungry giant.

Priya: [Laughs]

Leila: I'm really enjoying the phrase 'salt up your life' it's like a

Spice Girls parody.

Robin: Yeah, yeah, yeah.

Leila: Every boy and every girl, salt up your life.

Robin: Yeah.

Leila: [Sings] 'If you're feeling bland and lonely'.

Robin: Season! Season!

Leila: Yeah [Laughs].

Priya: I think your point that he's like woken her up at one in

the morning to rag on her for throwing out some chilli is

a good point.

Robin: To say 'Where the fuck is the chilli?'

Leila: Yeah.

Priya: How confused would you be if someone woke you up to

be like 'Where the fuck is the chilli?' How would you

react?

Robin: I mean I reckon she was stewing, no pun intended, all

evening, just ready for him to come up the stairs. Because the producer Steve pointed out, who owns an 11

litre slow cooker? That is so much food.

Priya: Yeah.

Leila: I didn't realise what a crock-pot was.

Robin: I've got a crock-pot.

Leila: Have you?

Robin: They're marvellous.

Leila: Do you make chilli in it?

Robin: Oh the amount of quarts that I eat. I don't even know

what food is, I just say to my wife 'Pour another quart, pour a quart down me, just don't you dare fucking salt it'.

[Laughs]

Leila: All right, who's an asshole then?

Robin: Do you think the girl is in the wrong for throwing the food

away?

Priya: I don't think she is. It's like she paid for it and made it.

And also, this is her snapping. If that's you snapping, you're probably fine, you're probably an all right person.

Some people kill.

Leila: Yeah I mean yeah I sort of agree. But everyone has done

stuff they regret. I feel like she probably regrets it. The fact she's on this website writing it, I think we can forgive.

We've all snapped before.

Robin: I never forgive anybody who has written on this website

[laughs].

Priya: [Laughs]

Leila: Yeah.

Robin: For me this is the most unforgiveable thing you could do

[laughs].

Priya: [Laughs]

Leila: [Laughs]

Robin: Yeah I think it's fine. I think if she buys and cooks

everything then she needs to break up with this

scoundrel.

Leila: Yeah I agree actually.

Robin: He's the asshole, 100%.

Leila: Yeah he's an asshole. He sounds scary as well.

Priya: Yeah.

Leila: Imagine bursting in on your partner in the middle of the

night.

Robin: 'Where the fuck is my chilli?'

Priya: Where's my 9 litres of chilli? I was hungry.

[Here to Judge Interim Music]

Leila: 'Am I the asshole for making kids yell penis and vagina so

it no longer was funny? A couple years ago, I had to teach a course over the summer to like 11 to 14 year olds about animals, and sexual reproduction came up. Every time I said words like penis, sperm, vagina, or whatever they would all giggle. It got annoying so I said 'Class everyone say penis' and I'd make them say it like 30 times so it wasn't funny anymore. Same with vagina and all the other words. I literally made them say it for eight or so

minutes until they got annoyed.

Now when I taught the class it was no longer funny. I got a parent a few weeks later complaining about it saying I shouldn't be saying those words so excessively around them and I'm inappropriate. I told her to 'Leave me alone and stop wasting my time'. She complained to my boss who was pissed at me for being rude to a parent and told me to apologise. Robin: Yeah.

Leila: Yeah, yeah, yeah.

Leila: Yeah, yeah, yeah.

Robin: I mean I'm a big fan of using the actual words for...

Leila: I'm a big fan of penis.

Robin: Yeah, yeah, yeah.

Leila: And vagina.

Robin: Everything, all of it. Sperm. All the big words.

Priya: But see I like morning affirmations, penis and vagina, 80

times into the mirror.

Robin: Yeah, yeah absolutely. But I do it when I go for a run, I

scream it as I run [laughs].

Priya: [Laughs]

Leila: I don't think she's an asshole.

Robin: Is it a she, the OP?

Leila: Oh yeah I think so, isn't it? Or is it a dude?

Robin: I assumed it was a dude for some reason.

Leila: Do you know, it doesn't say.

Priya: No.

Robin: Well isn't that very modern? I think being that rude to a

parent is quite a male teacher thing to do.

Leila: Yeah that's true.

Robin: To be that sort of flippant about it.

Priya: Yeah, 'Leave me alone and stop wasting my time'.

Robin: Stop wasting my time, I've got some four-year-olds to

shout 'cunt' in a minute, you're wasting their education.

Leila: Yeah, yeah, yeah.

Priya: I'm busy actually.

Robin: Ofsted are coming and they're going to fail us actually.

Priya: Eight minutes of it, that does seem excessive to me.

Robin: It is excessive.

Priya: Because like for kids as well, eight minutes feels like

hours.

Leila: Yeah that's a lot.

Robin: Is this like an actual lesson or is it summer school?

Leila: I bloody hope it's a lesson.

Priya: 'I had to teach a course over the summer, 11 to 14'. But

it's about animals and sexual...

Leila: Do you know now that I'm thinking about it, it's a bit

Robin: Yeah sure it depends on their reaction isn't it?

Leila: What, the teacher's?

Robin: Yeah I think so.

Leila: Yeah say it, say it again.

Priya: But this is maths.

Robin: Yeah, yeah exactly. Yeah two vaginas plus four vaginas

equals how many vaginas?

Leila: [Laughs] I really love this cockney teacher. Cockney

teacher, ha, ha, ha, ha, laughs]

Robin: Yeah the fact that he's kept his job as well, like 'I nearly

lost my job about it'. Well yeah.

Leila: Yeah but you didn't.

Robin: You were rude to a parent. I feel that like, I mean I think

bossy parents are also pretty shitty people, you know the people who complain. It's like get over it, they're going to

learn way worse than that.

Priya: Yeah. Also it was a couple of years ago, they've said. So

it's like, really no longer relevant, because I feel like if you did this now there would be more parents being like 'Oh

yeah say penis and vagina'.

Leila: Oh that's why we need him, because if you're still

thinking about making children shout genitals years later,

Robin: Yeah has it still annoyed him?

Priya: Well he listens to the recording every day doesn't he?

Eight minutes of penis and vagina.

Robin: [Laughs]

Leila: This is really bad because I was really fine with this until

the suggestion that it was a man. And now I find it really

uncomfortable, so that is bad.

Priya: [Laughs]

Robin: How dare you?

Leila: I know. I know. I'm just such a, I don't know, what's the

word?

Robin: What would it be?

Priya: Misandrist?

Leila: Penis, penis, I don't know.

Robin: So what are you thinking then, asshole? Teacher asshole?

Kids assholes? It's usually kids are assholes isn't it?

Priya: Yeah.

Robin: I don't think he's an asshole. I think he thinks he's in Dead

Poets Society but he's not.

Priya: The snitch is the asshole, the little kid that went home

and snitched to his parents.

Robin: Yeah that's very, very true.

Priya: Snitches get stitches...

Robin: Snitches get detention where they have to shout out

'vulva' for half an hour.

[Here to Judge- Episode 9]

Priya: [Laughs]

Leila: Yeah.

Robin: But no, yeah I think he's half an asshole. And everyone is.

Let's split it.

[Here to Judge Interim Music]

Priya: 'Hello Reddit, I, 20 male have accidentally Pavloved

myself to poop every time I cum'.

Robin: [Laughs]

Leila: [Laughs]

Priya: 'And there has been a strain in my relationship' and then

it's got 22 female, I assume that's the details of their

partner. Oh dear [laughs].

Leila: [Laughs]

Priya: 'So when I was younger I was only able to masturbate

when I was going to poop because of privacy reasons in

my home.' Sure.

Robin: [Laughs]

Priya: 'So sooner or later I would jerk off' I'm like, I'm adult and

I'm reading this aloud.

Leila: [Laughs]

Robin: I haven't stopped giggling since you've said the word

'poop' so you know.

Leila: Yeah.

Priya: [Laughs] 'So sooner or later I would jerk off and then go
