Robin: Welcome to Here to Judge where we scour the internet

to dissect dilemmas and decide who's to blame.

Leila: Here to Judge today we have me, Leila Navabi.

Robin: Me, Robin Morgan.

Priya: Me, Priya Hall and our wonderful live audience from

Assembly Festival in Coventry!

[Applause and Cheers]

Leila: 'Am I the asshole for buying a pet lobster?'

[Laughter]

'I 29 F, really love weird exotic pets.' Aww right. 'Right

now I have a few babies. Honey' I know.

[Laughter]

'Honey, Lola and Genie (3F) are my sugar gliders.' I don't

know what that is? If it's anything like a sugar daddy?

[Laughter]

Priya: Have they got like?

Leila: But they serve [laughs]

[Laughter]

Leila: 'Frank 1, M is my hedgehog. And Gloria 9, F, is my

axatol?'

Priya: Axolotl.

Leila: What's?

Robin: Is this Pokémon?

Priya: Do you not know what an axolotl is?

Robin: No.

Priya: [Draws breath shocked]

Leila: OK.

Priya: You know what an axolotl is?

Times Man: Yeah it's a lizard, we did a Times crossword together and

ironically that was the clue two weeks ago.

Leila: Really?

Priya: You smashed it.

Robin: What a high culture audience we're getting.

Leila: Yeah I know I'm actually genuinely like quite intimidated.

Robin: Oh my fucking god.

Leila: I'm way too thick to be this right now.

Robin: Here we're going to talk about pooey frogs. Christ.

Leila: [Laughs]

Priya: It's a weird juvenile lizard that never really grows up. Isn't

it? That's what an axolotl is isn't it? It's like a juvenile version of a different lizard and they thought they were

different animals, no.

Leila: I told my lizard story about how I had a pet lizard.

[Laughter]

Leila: I had a pet lizard when I was little because my parents

were allergic to animals and I used to beg them and beg them for a pet. And my mum when I was five was like 'Yeah when you're nine you can have a lizard' thinking I'd

forget about it. But I'm a stubborn person. And so I didn't

forget and then I got a pet lizard and it was a leopard gecko and fuckin' hated it the entire time I had it. And then a mealworm ate it from the inside out and it bled to death.

[Laughter]

[Laughs] Now I'm a comedian so.

Robin: [Laughs]

Leila: Trauma affects us in various ways. I'm going to continue

with this now. I'm glad you find that so funny. I buried it

in a Clark's shoebox.

Priya: [Laughs] It's the amount of times we've heard her say this

on this podcast.

Robin: A what box?

Leila: A Clark's.

Priya: And she always says that story and she always says it at

that speed. Just get it done.

Leila: Yeah I know because it's quite dramatic to relive. It was

horrible though, I hated it. I never touched it. That's

probably why it died of. Anyway, let's continue.

[Laughter]

Shhh.

Robin: [Laughs] Shushing the audience. Shushing them on our

first ever live show.

Leila: Yeah, yeah, yeah. This is very serious. 'I've always wanted

to open up my own exotic rescue and if I had the money to' wait what? 'If I had the money to but that's beside the point. Basically exotic animals are a huge part of my life

and always will be.' Not until the mealworm eats it from

the inside out, OK.

Priya: [Laughs]

Leila: 'Please note, I work from home and have since entered

the workforce and plan to continue' what workforce? What's that? Is that like the police force, the workforce?

Priya: That's just the general capitalist workforce I think.

Leila: OK.

Robin: She's got a job, got a job.

Leila: OK I've since got a job, let's just say it how it is 'And plan

to continue until I retire' [laughs] OK.

[Laughter]

Leila: Right, I have more than enough time for all of my

animals. The Sugar Gliders' capital letters, 'especially need the love'. My boyfriend (I'll call him Brad) 30, male and I have been dating for eight months and things are starting to get serious. We have not discussed moving in or the future much but he's the perfect guy in every regard. Especially because he loves my animals as much

as he loves me.'

Robin: Oh fuck.

[Laughter]

Leila: If this is going to become bestiality I don't want to do it.

OK 'Last week I decided to spring on an animal'.

Robin: There it is [laughs]

Leila: [Laughs] 'I'd wanted since college. A lobster. I already had

an adequately sized tank and I was financially able to add

a new pet to the squad.'

Robin: Squad!

Leila: 'So while searching for fish to add to existing tank, I found

lobsters for sale and I purchased one. His name is George and he is so perfect, I could watch him for hours, such a

good little guy'. She's on the lobster, that's what she's.

'Brad does not agree with me. Brad hates George. Brad thinks it's a jerk move not to consult him before purchasing George even though we don't live together and have no intention to move in anytime soon. Apparently if I'd asked, he would have said not to buy George because he thinks a lobster is a stupid pet and that it serves no purpose other than to be eaten. He threatened to cook George if I did not return him. Since then, I took away his apartment key and told him off.'

[Laughter]

Wait, his apartment key to his apartment? He's homeless now.

Robin: [Laughs] I thought it was George's apartment key.

Leila: Yeah [laughs] good. 'I asked him' good, well done.

Robin: [Laughs]

Leila:

'I asked him not to speak to me or come by my house until I figured out what to do. My mum thinks I'm an idiot for turning away a perfect guy over a lobster. She has always disapproved of me for not wanting children and just wanting animals though, so I take her opinion with a grain of salt [laughs]' Not even a pinch, it's like I only need one and then I'm done. 'Some of my friends that that Brad is bordering on abusive behaviour but I feel that's too rash to say. Another one of my friends pointed out that maybe Brad had wanted to move in but I bought George before giving Brad the chance to invite me to move in. So I was really in the wrong. Since Tuesday I've not seen or spoken to Brad but we are technically still dating. I don't know what to do. Please Reddit, am I the asshole for buying a pet lobster?' And then we have an edit. I realised that Reddit, is that something to do with edit? Why is it called that? OK hang on, let me just read the edits.

Priya: [Laughs]

[Laughter]

Leila:

'All my pets are captive bred and were their parents and likely their grandparents. They are not suitable for the wild and they are not wild animals. If I realise them to their natural habitats they would not survive. I do not support wild caught exotic pets, never will.' ET 2. ETA 2, estimated time of arrival, what does that mean? OK 'My animals have the proper enclosures and are absolutely spoiled rotten. My pets are my babies and I could never do anything but give them the best life possible.'

Robin: Christ.

Priya: Jesus Christ!

Robin: There's a lot there.

Priya: Yeah. Imagine threatening to cook your partner's pet?

Leila: No but. Right, I hate that people have lobsters for food.

Well you know [laughs hysterically].

Priya: Every time that we get a story that involves any sort of

animal, Leila has strong opinions on the animal.

Leila: Yeah I do, lobsters aren't in the unit, they're not. So

they're...

Robin: Do you like lobsters?

Leila: OK I should go into units, I'll be really quick.

Robin: Yup.

Leila: Because I know we are running out of time. Let me just

say really quick, I believe that there are units and measurements for loving animals and I think that say a human is 40 units, as a human you are allowed to love anything that is between 4 units and say 60 units. But

anything above that is. So a horse, too many units.

[Laughter]

Way too many units. And then you get like a rabbit is not enough units. So that's like 4. Sorry if you've got rabbits, you can't love them, they don't love you.

[Laughter]

Guinea pigs are also like maybe 2 units. And it's not about necessarily their size but it's also about how intelligent they are and how intuitive. It's a unit of measurement and I don't know what it measures yet. We'll get there.

Priya:

For reference we had to dedicate an entire episode to explaining Leila's unit system. So you getting a quick catch up there sounds absolutely mental but there is some logic behind it.

Leila:

OK yeah there is, there is. Listen to the podcast. OK what I'm going to say first is imagine if you listened to the podcast then you wouldn't be here now [laughs]. Do some research next time it's your own fault.

[Laughter]

I'm going to say that ultimately lobsters aren't within the units you're allowed to love. But I think it's cruel to let them sit in a tank and then boil them while they're alive which is what normally happens to lobsters. And thus I would rather this person keep the lobster as a pet than do that to it. Because that makes me sad.

Priya:

I really want you to look up an axolotl and see what your opinions are on them.

Leila:

OK. How do I spell it.

Priya:

Α...

Leila:

Rob?

[Laughter]

Is it Rob?

Rob: I think it's a-o-x-t-y-o-l wasn't it?

Leila: a-o-x-t...

Robin: It was 13 down wasn't it?

Leila: Yeah. Oh hang on, it's telling me 'Our systems have just

detected unusual traffic.' And now I have to do one of these fuckin' things where you have to say you're not a

robot.

[Laughter]

Right hang on.

Robin: Choose all the images that are lobsters. No!!!

[Laughter]

Priya: There are not enough units!

Robin: Choose all images 40 units or above.

[Laughter]

Leila: Do you know what it's not working so I think I'm a robot, I

think that's that. I don't know what it is.

Priya: OK I'm going to find it.

Leila: Yeah please find it.

Priya: Carry on amongst yourselves.

Leila: So it's what? Like a lizard? I'm really going to hate it

though because I'm really. How small is it?

Robin: Yeah lovely Times man has put his hand up to ask a

question.

Leila: Sorry go on.

Times Man: I think your unit system makes perfect sense.

Leila: [Draws breath shocked]

Times Man: What if a person is subhuman and they're only like 30, 25, etcetera (inaudible)

Robin: Did you say subhuman?

[Laughter]

Priya: Yeah let's not get into what subhuman means.

Leila: Yeah at least that's not what women are. Kidding,

kidding.

[Laughter]

Priya: On a Wednesday night in Coventry, let's not have that

conversation.

Leila: OK.

Robin: You do read The Times don't you?

Leila: I really, really hate it.

Robin: The fuck is that?

Priya: Ah ha.

Leila: That's a axolotl. Biology's beloved amphibian said no one

ever.

Priya: I didn't type that in so.

Leila: I really hate it and I think it's below whatever unit

because again what are the other measurements for units? If it's below four units it means it could fit up your

bum.

Priya: Oh, yeah, yeah we should have started with that.

Robin: Does it still make sense sir?

[Laughter]

Leila: I don't want anything that could fit inside me!

Priya: Can any subhumans fit up the bum? Who's to know.

Leila: I don't want any that could fit inside of me or kill me.

Robin: A mealworm.

Priya: Literally anything.

Leila: Yeah. No.

[Laughter]

No, no, no.

Priya: I mean technically anything could kill you.

Leila: That's not true.

Priya: [Laughs]

[Laughter]

Robin: Good night everybody [laughs]

Leila: We can't do this. I can't do this [laughs]. Right lets, what

do we think? What's your general consensus on this

person?

Priya: I think she is an asshole for keeping an lobster as a pet.

Leila: What would you rather she did with it though?

Priya: Ummmmmm? Threw it in the sea. No but it would be

fine, lobsters would survive in the sea even if they were

captive bred right?

Leila: Yeah I think so right.

Priya: Like what actually is a lobster's survival? They just chill.

Leila: How are they going to die in the sea? Are they just

socially awkward with no friends and die of loneliness at

the end of the sea.

Priya: Yeah.

Leila: First of all, if anyone's seen Little Mermaid.

Priya: Right OK.

Leila: That's a lobster isn't it?

Priya: Yeah that it a lobster.

Leila: So I think they're fine in the sea.

Priya: Because they can do wonderful musical numbers.

Leila: Yeah exactly.

[Laughter]

Priya: And they'll make friends that way.

Leila: Yeah exactly yeah. So I think it's fine. I think lobsters in

the sea is fine. That's where I would put them. Because I'd rather them die in the sea than in a vat of hot water in

a restaurant.

Robin: I mean the sad thing about the planet is that the sea is

warming up so much.

[Laughter]

Leila: And I'm the young one who is a nihilist.

Priya: Are we environmental activists?

Robin: I think we are.

Leila: Yeah and we've come to Coventry to change the world

[laughs]. OK should we conclude this basically?

Robin: I think we can conclude and then try one more in the 11

minutes that we have left.

Leila: Oh my god that went really long. That big.

Priya: OK.

Leila: OK I'm going to do my thing and then we can choose one

to do as the final one. We can let the audience choose

which one and we'll give the title...

Robin: That's a cute idea.

Leila: OK but I think this woman is [blows trumpet] and asshole.

Robin: I think she is an asshole for calling all of her pets babies

[plays frog].

Priya: Like hard agree with that. I also think the boyfriend is an

asshole as well for wanting to eating her pet [Gong].

Leila: Good. And then audience what do we think? If you think

asshole say asshole after three. One, two, three.

[Asshole!]

Leila: OK we'll not even do the other one.

Rob: [Plays triangle]

Leila: Good OK.

Priya: Beautiful. You're smashing that.

Robin: You're doing really well mate.

Leila: Yeah you're doing really good. Four years training I mean.

[Applause]

[Here to Judge-Interim Music]

Leila: Let's read those, do you want to read them out Robin and

then we can decide?

Robin: OK so.

Leila: This is your choice.

Robin: You have the choice audience of Coventry. 'Am I the

asshole for suing my girlfriend after she had my 1967 Impala Project taken to the scrap yard?' Sounds American doesn't it? 'Am I the asshole for throwing a soda on the ground near the dude I bought it for?' That sounds

weirdly more American.

Priya: [Laughs]

[Laughter]

Robin: 'Am I the asshole for forgetting about a date?' 'Am I the

asshole for asking girlfriend to not leave cat piss removal

enzyme in an unmarked mason jar on the bed stand?'

[Laughter]

I'm going to decide for you.

[Laughter]

Leila: OK I think that one. We're all happy with that one yeah?

OK yeah we're going to do that.

Robin: Happy for me to read?

Leila: Yeah please.

Robin: [Clears throat] 'Am I the asshole for asking girlfriend to

not leave cat piss removal enzyme in an unmarked mason jar on the bed stand? My girlfriend and I have a couple of kittens, they peed on a comforter yesterday as kittens do

and we washed it. We have a mason jar of Nature's Miracle Urine Removing Enzyme on hand that we use

that is marked as such on the lid (we poured it from a Costco sized container from my girlfriend's sister).

Or at the very least conspicuously mark it. She angrily said that whatever happens to me drinking from a mason jar that I didn't pour was entirely my fault and she had absolutely no blame in me drinking the cat piss enzyme.' How many times have I said cat piss

enzyme?

[Laughter]

It's the drinking game for the podcast.

Leila: The title of the podcast.

Robin: Yeah, yeah, Cat Piss Enzyme.

Priya: Cat Piss Enzyme in Coventry.

Robin: Yeah live from Coventry, Cat Piss Enzyme.

Leila: Yeah good.

[Laughter]

Robin: 'I didn't even necessarily need an apology, I just wanted

her to be mindful of leaving out potentially gut

destroying chemicals. Am I the asshole? Also, I drank cat piss enzyme, ask me anything.'

Leila: What?

Robin: You know there's like an Ask Me Anything thread on

Reddit where like...

Priya: It's a different sub Reddit.

Robin: Yeah.

Leila: Shut up! It's not about that, this is Am I the Asshole.

Robin: I didn't write it.

Leila: OK [laughs] Are you sure?

Robin: Yeah.

Leila: OK let me smell your burp [laughs].

Priya: What is cat piss enzyme? Does anyone here know?

Robin: Great question. It was six across in a Times crossword.

Priya: Yeah very, very good.

Leila: I know exactly what this is because I have a cat. I do.

Priya: I have a cat and I don't have any enzymes hanging

around.

Leila: But does your cat piss itself?

Priya: No in fairness. No cat pisses itself unless it's wearing

trousers.

[Laughter]

Robin: And that's a hill I'll die on.

Leila: Yeah great OK.

Priya: Facts are fact my friend.

Leila: You can clean my rug then on account of that thought. So

I don't know what's in it, I have not got a clue. And also

I've never referred to it as cat piss enzyme.

Robin: Mm.

Leila: I'd be like it's this thing that you put on the cat piss to

stop it smelling bad.

Priya: Oh OK. Like Febreze?

Leila: No but it only works on cat piss. Because of the enzymes I

guess [laughs].

[Laughter]

Robin: And it would just be like?

Leila: Yeah what I'm confused about is that this person has said

that nature's miracle which being mostly water is clear.

Priya: I think that's the name of the brand, that's not what he's

referring to water as, nature's miracle.

Leila: Oh right OK [laughs].

Priya: A cold glass of nature's miracle? Yes please.

[Laughter]

Leila: Yeah what's in it OK.

Robin: My, my this nature's miracle, have you tried it? Oh.

Leila: I don't know what enzyme is in it though. And also why

do the burps smell like laundry?

[Laughter]

Robin: Do you reckon it's got some sort of like uh? Like not

flavour.

Priya: Scent.

Robin: That's the one.

[Laughter]

Leila: Like at Nando's just like.

Robin: Nose flavour.

Leila: Nose flavour [laughter]

Priya: The nerd of the group.

Leila: Right, I've had a difficult my girlfriend has had, do you

know what micellar water is, everyone here? Yeah we're getting nods, so it's like that thing you use to clean your face and wash your makeup off and it's sort of like you put it on your face. Again basically water but it's got

some micellar in it, whatever that is.

Robin: Yeah.

Leila: And it destroys your makeup. So my girlfriend thought it

would be a really nice idea to put bleach in one of those

with water to clean the toilet with.

Robin: Yeah.

Leila: And guess who used it on their face?

Robin: Fuck!

Priya: Oh!

Leila: I was fine because actually it was like heavily diluted.

Robin: Oh my...

Leila: But that could have gone so bad!

Robin: Yeah.

Leila: So I am inclined to think that you should never put any

like corrosive chemical, I learned that one in GCSE

chemistry thank you.

[Laughter]

On anything [laughs] She knows the word corrosive.

Priya: She's very clever.

Leila: Yeah very smart. Do you know what I mean though like?

Robin: Totally.

Leila: So I don't, I think he should count himself lucky that he

didn't put bleach on his face.

Priya: Oh for sure. For sure, for sure. Also, I mean why are they

putting it in a mason jar to begin with? What kind of

Pinterest nightmare are they living in...

Robin: [Laughs]

Leila: Yeah.

Priya: ...where that is necessary?

Leila: Anyone who has got mason jars like around their house...

Priya: Don't trust them?

Leila: No.

Robin: Yeah get off Etsy.

Priya: Yeah.

Leila: Is anyone like that? Is anyone like really into?

Priya: Any overnight oat pricks in?

Leila: Yeah joy, because that's what we need. No. This is why I

love Coventry [laughs] I've decided based on the

population that everyone here is sound.

Robin: I think that I don't care about these people.

Priya: Oh.

Leila: Well that's the end of the podcast then isn't it?

Robin: No I don't know I just.

Leila: Well pretend fuckin' hell.

Robin: Sorry I'm just a bit sleepy. I think you're right, I think

anyone chucking shit into a random jar and not marking

is deserving of jail.

Leila: Have you done any of this? Would you? Do you know

there's some people that like put toothpaste in like soap

dispensers.

Robin: Oh yeah it just seems exhausting.

Leila: Why?

Robin: It's just to make their downstairs loo look a bit, when it's

from Home Bargains.

Priya: Yeah.

Leila: But then you go to wash your hands and it's just like

mint.

[Laughter]

Leila: Yeah do you know what I mean?

Robin: Yeah how many times during the pandemic have you

pressed like a squeezy thing and it's not hand gel and it's

soap.

Priya: Yeah.

Robin: And then you just sort of rub soap into your hands.

[Laughter]

Leila: Yeah, yeah.

Robin: I'm just bubbly all day. I'd rather Covid.

Leila: [Laughs]

Priya: What you need is some cat piss enzyme to wash it off.

Robin: Yeah, yeah, yeah. A bit of fuckin' bleach and...

Leila: Do you know what' ironic about those? Is that I honestly

think that if you're going to catch Covid from anywhere

it's one of those.

Robin: Yeah, yeah, Yeah but then you...

Priya: Then you immediately wash your hand.

Leila: Then you immediately wash your hand but then like I'm

worried that it's not effective somehow because you've just touched it. Like isn't it like I've just been on the train so now I'll do it. Whereas if you just touch something and

you're just going to put this on.

Priya: I do like the automatic ones like beep!

Leila: Yeah I'm all about that. I'm all about, I don't want to

touch...

Priya: Is this comedy?

Leila: ...anything or anyone.

Robin: Have you done the ones where you think it's an electric

one and it's not?

Priya: Yeah.

Robin: And then you just look like you don't know how things

work.

[Laughter]

Leila: Yeah.

Priya: Someone else press it for me.

Robin: Yeah, yeah, yeah, yeah. Boy!

Leila: [Laughs] I imagine that that is such a cool job.

Robin: The pressy pressy?

Leila: Being the person who presses it.

Priya: But you hate the pressing.

Robin: Oh but that's the person who would catch it because they

don't rub it into their hands.

Leila: Yeah but they deserve it.

Robin: [Laughs]

Leila: That's the punishment for all these assholes is that we're

going to now put them into our shops and they're going

to be the one that has to press the...

Robin: The depressor.

Leila: [Sings] Press the button.

Priya: There are so many of them though they'd have to queue

up to do it and they do it like probably once every hour.

We'd be hiring so many people to do that job.

Leila: Yeah. What about the ones with your feet, have you had

that yet? You press it with your foot. I hate when they're

like that.

Robin: No.

Priya: Oh like a pedal bin?

Leila: Like a pedal bin but with sanitiser.

Priya: Genius. Dirty feet.

Robin: Oh I thought you meant like the gel would go on your

feet.

[Laughter]

And it would be like that thing that they did in

supermarkets ten years ago where fish at your feet.

Priya: Oh yeah.

Robin: Do you remember that?

A: Yes.

Robin: Imagine if you could train fish to eat Covid.

Priya: That's where Covid came from.

Robin: Do you think so?

Priya: No [laughs].

Leila: That was weird, where did all those fish go? Has that

woman adopted them?

Robin: I think they're deep frying it out there.

Leila: [Laughs] That's slander.

Robin: We've got one minute to go.

Leila: So let's just conclude this one.

Robin: I think that the man is not the asshole, I think his

girlfriend is the asshole [plays frog].

Leila: I also think his girlfriend is. It's sad we all agree because

normally we don't all agree but I also think asshole [plays

trumpet].

Priya: What if I just disagreed for fun?

Leila: I can see it in your eyes that you don't.

Priya: I think the man is not the asshole. I think you need to be

more concerned about your girlfriend putting bleach in

things [gong].

[Laughter]

Leila: Yeah that's true.

Robin: For this final one, audience shout asshole if you think the

man is the asshole.

[Silence]

Oh OK, shout not asshole.

[Not asshole!]

Leila: What?

M: [Plays triangle]

Robin: That was it wasn't it?

Priya: He's not the asshole because he's the one that drank cat

piss out there.

Leila: Oh yeah fine good. OK. I thought you were, OK never

mind, I was like but I just told you about my bleach story.

OK well this has been nice [laughs].

Robin: It has been.

Leila: Have you had an all right time?

[Yes!]

Are you going to subscribe to the podcast? [Laughs] Yeah

consider it.

[Laughter]

Priya: We're not doing a great job of it. We've really hurt the

brand today.

Robin: Genuinely thank you for coming, have you enjoyed

yourselves?

[Yes!]

Thank you, I think it's going to be aired in a couple of

weeks right.

Leila: They said we have to throw these in the audience.

Robin: I think...

Leila: Do you know what, I've just blown in this, it's Covid!

Robin: Yeah I think he was joking?

Priya: Yeah we don't actually throw a gong at the audience.

Leila: Oh.

[Laughter]

Robin: I'm not giving this away. But I think you can keep that.

Priya: Can we have a round of applause for Rob?

Robin: Yeah a lovely round of applause for Rob, well done.

[Applause]

Rob: [Plays triangle]

Robin: By the way, when you go home holding that you're going

to look like such a hipster.
